Clinical Cases

Clinical cases are examples of injuries that have been successfully treated with FES. Specific cases were selected because they were treated exclusively with the FES modality and have documentation of the treatment progress. These examples are offered only as an overview of a specific case, which may or may not apply to another similar case. Each clinical case will provide specific issues unique to that particular horse.

“Trotter”

4-yr old gelding – Standardbred

Right Shoulder Atrophy

7 FES Treatments over 3 days 3Tx shoulder and 3Tx T10-L6

SUMMARY: Upon examination the right triceps was atrophied, the right scapula was rolled forward and positioned lower than the left scapula. Spasticity was detected during palpation of shoulder muscles and in thorax and sacrum. The sacrum was twisted, pushing the horse’s hips to the left. 2 FES treatments were performed for 3 consecutive days. Each day, 1 FES treatment to the triceps and 1 FES treatment to the thorax were given. Further treatments to the sacrum would have been preferred, but were not performed.
