Clinical Cases

Clinical cases are examples of injuries that have been successfully treated with FES. Specific cases were selected because they were treated exclusively with the FES modality and have documentation of the treatment progress. These examples are offered only as an overview of a specific case, which may or may not apply to another similar case. Each clinical case will provide specific issues unique to that particular horse.

“Mimi”

5-yr old Thoroughbred mare

Uneven Gait - Rearing

4 FES Treatments over 2 days

SUMMARY: Upon examination the mare showed distinct atrophy of the right gluteals and severe spasticity in the thoracic and sacral lumbar regions. The horse was grade 2 lame when tracking right and grade 1 lame when tracking left. The mare consistently reared and would not move willingly forward especially when tracking right. 2 FES treatments T18-S2; 1 FES treatment T13-L6; 1 FES treatment gluteals. During riding after the 4 treatments, the rider said the mare was much more willing to move forward and did not rear. Follow-up treatments were not performed because the mare did not exhibit the rearing tendency again.
